As an Education Leader, you'll play a key part in creating a safe, supportive and inspiring environment where children can flourish. You'll help improve well-being and educational outcomes for children who need it most – as well as sometimes helping the wider team with a Viking Raid or a bushcraft session.

Key Responsibilities

- Deliver the day-to-day operations of The Nest program, ensuring a safe and nurturing environment for up to 8 children per session.
- Support in the planning of activities and learning sessions that promote positive experiences, emotional regulation and peer relationships.
- Collaborate with the team to implement a curriculum that addresses the individual needs of the children.
- Help monitor and evaluate the program's effectiveness, adjusting as necessary.
- Work closely with the Nest Co-ordinator to support the implementation of the project.
- Be part of a positive and inclusive team culture that prioritise the well-being of both the children and the Nest team.
- Engage in regular team meetings and reflective sessions to ensure continuous improvement and learning.



- Build and maintain relationships with local organisations and professionals in the field of child well-being and trauma. Seek opportunities for collaboration and resource sharing to enhance the impact and sustainability of The Nest.
- Contribute to accurate records of children's progress, achievements, and any incidents.
